Definition of a QR Code




- ► A QR code or Quick Response Code is a:
 - ► Two-dimensional (2D) barcode.
 - Small square of dots with over 4000 characters.
- ▶ A QR Code contains encoded or pixelated information.
- ▶ A QR Code can be read or scanned by using an APP on a SmartPhone called a QR code reader.

Why Use QR Codes?

- QR codes are cutting-edge new marketing tools:
 - Free and easy way to connect with patrons and potential patrons
 - Demonstrate that your law library embraces emerging technologies
 - Particularly appeal to millennials and those in newer Gen Z and Gen Alpha generations who were born as digital natives

- Newsletters




Web pages

Google Chrome: Right click on the page and choose "view page source"

img= image alt=text string (e.g., a title) src=source (e.g., jpeg, png)

Caveats for Using QR Codes

Make sure to only link to content that is optimized for reading on mobile devices.

- Easy to read on small screens
- Content loads quickly

Leave some white space around each QR code to enable easy scanning.



How to Read/Scan QR Codes

- QR codes are read or scanned using an APP called a QR code reader or QR code scanner.
- Some newer SmartPhones come equipped with pre-installed QR code readers.
- We use:
 - ► Lightning QRcode Scanner (*free* from Application4u)
 - QR & Barcode Scaner (free from TeaCapps)
