The Ohio Constitution: Citizen-Initiated Amendments

Summary:

First drafted in 1802, the Ohio Constitution was re-written in 1851. But it is not a staid unchanging document, as a result of its amendment process. There are a few avenues to amend the constitution: the General Assembly can propose constitutional amendments for voter approval, and citizens can lead initiatives to adopt amendments for voter approval. This CLE will examine recent citizen-initiative amendments, including recent ones regarding reproductive rights and political gerrymandering.
